A 15-year member of the El Dorado Hills CA Rotary Club, Bill has served in several club & district leadership roles & is a major donor to The Rotary Foundation. In 2016-2017 Rotary D5180 awarded Bill "Rotarian of the Year" for his dedicated service to Rotary, & his commitment to the support & growth of ShelterBox USA.

Since beginning with ShelterBox after the 2010 Haiti earthquake, Bill has shared the ShelterBox story with thousands of Rotarians & organized fundraisers & awareness events for ShelterBox USA. In 2017, he helped lead the USA Ambassadorial team in raising \$1.4+ million for ShelterBox. For his volunteer efforts with ShelterBox USA. Bill has received the United States Presidential Volunteer Service Award seven times. After 30 years as a nuclear power plant inspector, Bill earned certification in Non-Profit management & joined the staff at ShelterBox USA in January 2019.






President Charlie reminded folks that "We're in the money!!" and we are seeking a Club Treasurer. This

President Charlie shared information about the Veterans' Coat Drive, noting that money was allotted by the Board at its meeting earlier

that morning. Individual cash donations will also be collected over the next two weeks at lunch.

CHICAGOLAND ROTARY VETERANS COAT DRIVE STAND DOWN DAY FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 15

Our goal is to collect and distribute 900 winter coats to Homeless Veterans in the Chicago area. Stand Down Day is a special day for homeless veterans in which they receive support from many health, social service, and community support organizations. The Chicago event is organized and staffed by volunteers from veteran organizations, community and social service organizations, and Hines VA and Jesse Brown VA.

This will be Rotary's eighth year participating in this event that has been held and organized for the past 25 years by the veterans. We expect to serve a little over 900 homeless veterans on November 15 as they gear up for the harsh winter months ahead. If you have not been to a Stand Down Day, we set up the coats along clothing racks organized by size and assist the veterans in selecting a coat and helping them try them on. The veterans then get winter clothing, medical and optical services, employment assistance, social service support for housing and food, haircuts, and a warm meal.

Rotary anniversaries were also celebrated:




Charles Wells lead with 27 years!! He was followed Mike Sletten with 12 years, Jim

The Indoor Ride to **End Polio**

In this event riders do an indoor bike ride for 30 to 60 minutes in order to raise donations for polio eradication.

The event aligns with the Miles To End Polio bike ride during the El Tour de Tucson on Nov. 23rd: https://www.endpolio.org/miles-to-end-polio

Each rider donates and/or solicits donations for PolioPlus [usually \$1 per minute]. The minimum will be \$30/rider in donations.

All funds raised are matched 2 to 1 by the Gates Foundation in support of Rotary's global efforts to eradicate polio.

WHAT and WHY: The Indoor Ride To End Polio* is a fun cycling event where riders do an indoor bike ride for 30 to 60 minutes in order to raise donations for polio eradication. Each rider donates and/or solicits donations for PolioPlus (usually \$1 per minute). All funds raised are matched 2 to 1 by the Gates Foundation in support of Rotary's global efforts to eradicate polio.
