

Club Treasurer. This person would work with Cathy




Yen who is currently serving as interim Treasurer following Ruth McLaren's move to Florida. The Board

From soup to nuts, our Russian Thanksgiving Potluck Feast was a HUGE success.






From set-up to take-down, under the direction of Linda Sahagian, the room was filled
