

President Eric led us in The Four-Way [now for us Six-Way] Test of the Things we Think, Say and Do and sent us on our way.





- Mental Health Task Force As we return more to "normal" in the wake of COVID, the impact and need of awareness and support for mental health is more vital than ever. Dr. Lisa Pinto of the Naperville After Dark club will be spearheading this initiative in finding projects, inspiring ideas, and coordinating efforts across the district.

We will continue to support in the vital areas of the Rotary International Foundation (chaired by Rachel Ossyra), PolioPlus (chaired by Mary Dankowski), Membership (chaired by DGN Conor Gee), and Public Image (chaired by Hunter Byington). Sad Youth Exchange News to Share

July 15, 2021 [from Sandy Gbur]: We got some terrible news yesterday. Natasha, our Palatine Rotary exchange student from Russia that we hosted in 2001, passed away from COVID two days after she gave birth to her daughter.

Natasha went on to be an incredible enthusiast for ecology and earned her PhD in geography. She taught us about Lake Baikal in Siberia which she so loved. Such a tragic loss of a young woman who grew in wisdom and professional stature with each passing year. We are so saddened for her family and all of us who were positively impacted by Natasha. Please enjoy every day as you never know how many more you have.

to the money for International Service projects? Here is just one example of our OPRF monies put to work on a valuable school building in Bolivia - The Bolivia-Holanda School - Kasa Huasa. Photos show various stages of construction.

At the end of 2012, we started helping the people of Kasa Huasa to build a school. We bought building materials in November 2012 and on February 1, 2013 there were three classrooms in which 80 students started. This was the beginning of the Bolivia-Holanda school in Kasa Huasa, just outside the city of Cochabamba [Bolivia].

After the first classrooms and a toilet building, a second floor has been realized. The playground is paved and a roof has been made to protect the children from the hot sun. A fence has been built around the school so that the children can play and learn safely.

In 2015 the roof will be installed on the second floor of the school. The schoolyard will be covered with a roof in 2016.

The school 'Bolivia Holanda' is currently asking for building materials for 2 extra classrooms, because they expect more children for next year and the government does not pay for the construction.
