Al Gini retired as Professor of **Business Ethics** in the Ouinlan School of Business at Loyola University Chicago.

He is the co-founder and long-time Associate Editor of **Business Ethics** Quarterly, the journal of the Society for Business Ethics.





27 years he was the Resident Philosopher on National Public Radio's Chicago affiliate, WBEZ-FM, and can currently be heard on WGN/Tribune Radio.

He also regularly lectures to community and professional organizations on cultural issues, business and ethics.







Nov. 17 Program: Club's committee structure

Club President Eric Van Ness presented a program on the club's committee structure.

Currently, the club is accepting nominations for club president for the 2024-25 year. The club is also accepting nominations for four 2-year director positions for the board starting in 2022.

He went on to describe the clubs current setup with Standing Commitee, a Task Force and Officers and Champions.

The Standing Committee meets regularly. The membership of each committee is set in advance. Each commite is led by a chair and vice chair. New members are assigned to these committees as they join. Each committee has specific responsibilities with goals set annually. The committee chair reports regularly to the board and presents at club assemblies.

Standing comittees are:

MEMBERSHIP: Committee has responsibility for recruiting, management of online inquiries, managing the approval process with the board, onboarding/welcoming new members into the Club. Suggested meeting every other month, with two new member orientations per year.

PR/COMMUNICATIONS: To develop and implement plans to provide the local public with information about Rotary and to promote the club's service projects and activities. To promote and encourage members to be active, promoting the club on social media. To monitor the upkeep and effectiveness of the club's website and weekly

newsletter RAZZ.

EVENTS & FUNDRAISING: Ensure coordination across events. Organize Installation, District Governor's Lunch, Holiday Party and Awards Breakfast. Create additional social events as requested by members. Oversee sponsorship program. Establish subcommittees for the Food Truck Rally, golf outing, centennial activities, Donut Day, Day In Our Village and parades. Ensure consistent messaging, resources and support across subcommittees.

CLUB SERVICE (Operations): Manage club operations (excluding treasury and governance). Secretary serves on the committee as co-chair; manage attendance and service hours reporting; run luncheon check-in; oversee printed member directory and Club Express member directory; liaison with Cucina Paradiso; District 6450/Rotary International connections, including Club Pride; and others as needed (such as managing the banners)

VOCATIONAL SERVICE & PROGRAMS: Plan and manage programs for weekly luncheons. Incorporate vocational service into programs in form of professional development programs and classification talks. Promote training opportunities available through the District.

COMMUNITY SERVICE & GRANTS: Select and coordinate volunteer local service projects; manage projects by identifying a project lead for each; keep website updated with volunteer opportunities; email membership once a week with opportunities; and manage the Community Grants process, including solicitation, evaluation, reporting and promotion.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE & GRANTS: Oversee global grants; recommend disbursement of funds to various international service projects; and collect information and pictures from projects to communicate our impact.

YOUTH SERVICE (New Generations & Grants): Recognizes the importance of empowering youth and young professionals through leadership development programs. Our Club provides service to youth through our Youth Exchange program, our scholarships and our support of the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) program. We also sponsor and support an Interact Club for middle and high school students.

The Task Force meets on an as-needed basis. Membership may be set based on role, established in advance or assigned as needed. Task forces report to the board.

Task Forces are:

BY-LAWS/MANUAL OF PROCEDURE: This task force conducts periodic reviews of the Club's organizing documents either at the request of the board or in conjunction with Rotary International's Council on Legislation.

CASSIN-GERMANSON FUND: This task force works with the OPRF Community Foundation setting up the fund which was established in 2020 to honor the memory of two of its most dynamic female members.

FINANCIAL REVIEW TEAM: Review finance functions of the club on an annual basis. The task force works with the treasurer, but the treasurer is not a member of the review team. The task force serves as a "check and balance" to ensure sound financial operations and continuity. The task force stands ready to step in to assist with the financial oversight of the club at the request of the president and the board. The task force could be convened to review management of funds held outside the club.

LITERACY: Identify and carry out projects to promote literacy in our area.

LONG-RANGE PLANNING: Stay abreast of changes coming from RI's Council on Legislation. The task force meets only as required when assigned a project. Typical projects include: Visioning, Strategic

Plan Development; review of ByLaws and MOP; review potential changes to membership or other global issues as directed by the President and the Board.

NOMINATING: This task force convenes in late autumn to create next year's slate of officers and directors to be presented at the January Annual Meeting.

ROTARIAN OF THE YEAR: Led by the previous ROY, this task force comprises all past ROYs. The team convenes in the spring to name this year's ROY in time for the May Awards Breakfast.

ADE ONAYEMI INDUCTION PLAN-NING: Tentative date is June 22, 2022 for induction as District Governor.

The Officers and Champions is made up of individual Rotarians with assigned roles and responsibilities.

Officers and Champions include:

Secretary: Responsible for all member data in both MyRotary, ClubExpress and Board reports. Data include membership status, attendance (received from Club Operations Committee) and service hour reporting.

Treasurer: Responsible for all financial recordkeeping, deposits and payments for the Club. Works directly with president-elect and board to set and approve budget. No need for a standing committee. Special projects assigned to Finance Review

Task Force. Treasurer works with that team as required and provides records to them for annual review.

Foundation Champion: RI's recognized Foundation Chair — acts as the club's liaison, recording secretary and chief ambassador for the Rotary Foundation. Coordinate with Program Chair to do a Foundation program in November. Best practices is to assign a co-chair.

Polio Champion: New role is responsible for keeping End Polio Now campaign top of mind among Rotarians. Assists PR Committee with Polio-related media from RI. Coordinates a Polio awareness builder/fundraiser for the club to coincide with World Polio Day on Oct. 24.
